- 15. Awards and prizes will be given at the discretion of the judges.

Region 14 Baking Contest – 2024 Chocolate Brownies

Ingredients:

1/2 cup butter

2 squares unsweetened baker's chocolate

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup flour

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. vanilla

2 eggs

Instructions:

- Melt butter and baker's chocolate in a sauce pan over medium temperature; remove from heat.
- 2. Combine all ingredients, except eggs, and mix.
- 3. Beat eggs in quickly for 300 strokes.
- 4. Pour mixture into greased and floured 8x8 pan.
- 5. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes or until a knife comes out clean.
- 6. Allow brownies to cool before slicing into 16 pieces.
- 7. Arrange six brownies on a disposable plate in a Ziploc-type bag.
